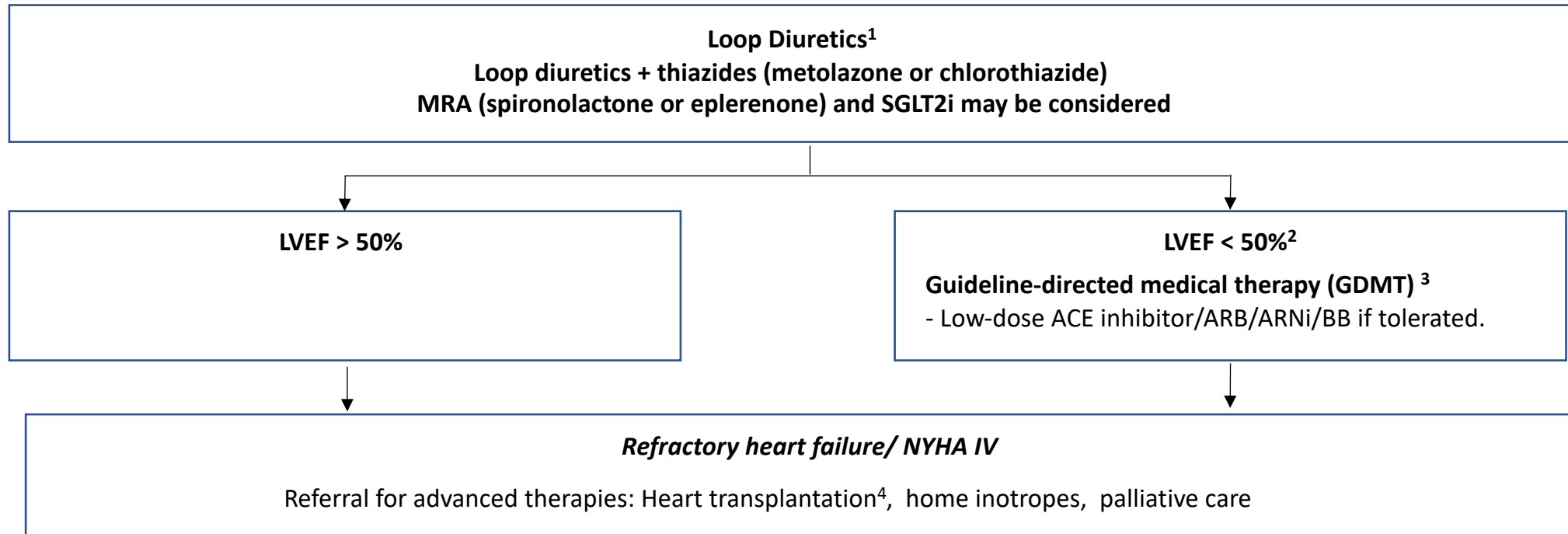


# Treatment of Heart Failure in AL amyloidosis



<sup>1</sup> Loop diuretics with higher bioavailability (torsemide or bumetanide) are recommended.

<sup>2</sup> Defibrillators can be considered in LVEF < 35%, but the benefit is unknown for primary prevention.

<sup>3</sup> Guideline-directed medical therapy (GDMT) can worsen orthostatic hypotension, fatigue and dyspnea. ***GDMT is often poorly tolerated, and intolerance is associated with worse outcomes.***

<sup>4</sup> Patient selection for transplantation is multidisciplinary and individualized. Contraindications for transplantation include: partial or no hematological response, multiorgan involvement, severe peripheral or autonomic dysfunction, GI involvement with malabsorption and malnutrition.
